1. GENERAL SITUATION

a. Not applicable.

b. Personnel and equipment of VMF-214, VMF-323 and VMF-312 will be airlifted to K-1 upon completion of the new strip. Upon arrival at K-1 operational control of the fighter squadrons will be assumed by Marine Aircraft Group 12. Three R4D aircraft and one R5D will be provided by the 1st Marine Air Wing to accomplish the lifting of squadron personnel and equipment.

2. MISSION

Marine Aircraft Group 33 will coordinate the movement of assigned units to K-1 maintaining the current unit close air support sortie rate during the movement.

d. HQSQ-33 will provide administrative Headquarters and communications

x. (1) VMF-312, VMF-214, VMF-323, will be prepared to move squadron personnel and equipment by airlift to K-1 upon forty-eight hour notice. Squadron aircraft will be flown from BOPU on a combat mission and will land at K-1, when directed. See Movement Table, Annex APLE, for detailed instructions.

1. General

VMF-214, VMF-323 and VMF-312, in that order, be prepared to move, when given forty-eight hours notice, to an airfield in South Korea to be orally announced at a later date. Movement of personnel and equipment to be made by air.

2. Loading

a. Equipment

All squadron equipment to be embarked to be delivered by each squadron to the Group Air Freight Officer at the Operations Building at Bofu, AFB. Equipment to be properly marked with squadron designation, weight and cube. Exact weight must be known on each item to be airlifted.

b. Personnel

Squadron Commanders to prepare rosters of personnel to be lifted so that not less than one officer is listed with total on each roster not to exceed twelve personnel. Airlift to be in twelve man increments. Operations will prepare schedule of aircraft departures and Squadron Commanders to have personnel to be embarked each flight at embarkation area thirty minutes prior to departure for assembly and muster. Weight of each man and his personal equipment must be known prior to embarkation.

c. Responsibility for Embarkation

The Air Freight Officer to be responsible for weighing in, manifesting and loading of all personnel and equipment to be embarked.

3. Supplies and Equipment to be Embarked

a. Class II and IIA

Maximum of twelve tons of aeronautical and administrative equipment to include TBA items and exclude all Section Baker and Roger.

b. Personal

Each individual embarked to take aboard with him his personal effects, individual equipment, cot, sleeping bag, bedding roll and winter clothing. In addition, all pilots to have complete outfitting of suitable flight clothing. Personal effects and above equipment of pilots flying squadron aircraft to be embarked with the equipment of the squadron.

c. Class V

Each individual embarked will be issued a unit of fire for the weapon carried prior at roster time by the Supply Officer, MAG-33.

d. Other Classes of Equipment and Supplies - None

4. Supply and Resupply

Supply and resupply at destination for all classes of property to be made by requisitioning from the Supply Officer, MAG-12. Vehicles required to be furnished by MAG-12.

Ad. Plan 2-51 (Contd)

5. Transportation

Transportation required incident to embarkation to be furnished on request by the Transportation Officer, MAG-33.

6. Unloading at Destination

Arrangements for unloading at destination will be made by Squadron Commanders concerned.

7. Uniform for Personnel Embarked

Utility uniform with appropriate weapon and field marching pack.





MAG-12, at K-1 Airfield in Korea; operations to commence on or about 1 February 1951. MCCIS-1, at K-1 Airfield in Korea; operations to commence on or about 23 January 1951. MTACS-2 Air Support Section; currently operating with 1st Marine Division. MTACS-2 Air Defense Section, at K-1 Airfield in Korea; operations to commence on or about 1 February 1951. VMO-6; currently operating with 1st Marine Division.

2. Service Troops

(a) MAG-33 will perform Class D maintenance for units based at BOFU

(b) MAG-12 will perform Class D maintenance for units based at K-1

(c) MAG-12 will assume operational control of Class C maintenance facilities at Itami. MAG-33 will augment MAG-12 with personnel and equipment.

(d) MWSS-1 will provide rear area logistic support at Itami Air Force Base in accordance with current directives.

3. Miscellaneous.

(a) A large percentage of material required for the operation of K-1 and the support of aircraft to be based at K-1, is now physically located in Korea. Organizational Commanders will take this into consideration when computing itemized requirements.

(b) All requisitions for items peculiar to the U. S. Marine Corps will be submitted to the Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, via Commanding General, 1st Marine Air Wing and Japan Logistical Command.

(c) MAG-33 will move all classes III, III(A), and V(A) supplies from railhead to BOFU Air Base.

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1stMAW ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER No. 2-51 (Cont'd)  
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(d) 2nd Logistical Command will provide transportation for movement of classes III, III(A) and V(A) supplies to K-1 airfield. MAG-12 will provide supervisory personnel as required to augment 2nd Logistical Command to insure sufficient supply of these classes to meet the tactical operational commitments.

(e) Cold weather clothing will be issued by the Supply Officer, Marine Wing Service Squadron 1 to personnel destined to Korea, upon request of squadron commander.

(f) POL and Ammunition Inventory Reports will be submitted to this headquarters, (G-4 Section), daily as of 1600, covering the previous 24 hour period.





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

(e) Cold weather clothing will be issued by the Supply Officer, Marine Wing Service Squadron 1 to personnel destined to Korea, upon request of squadron commander.

(f) POL and Ammunition Inventory Reports will be submitted to this headquarters, (G-4 Section), daily as of 1600, covering the previous 24 hour period.


