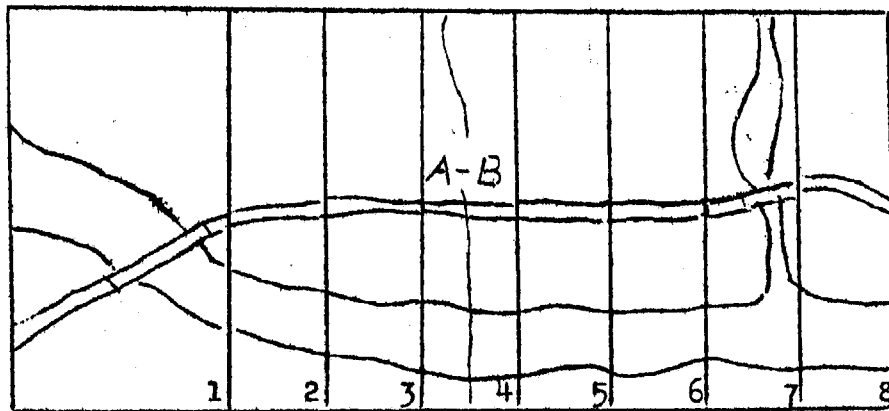

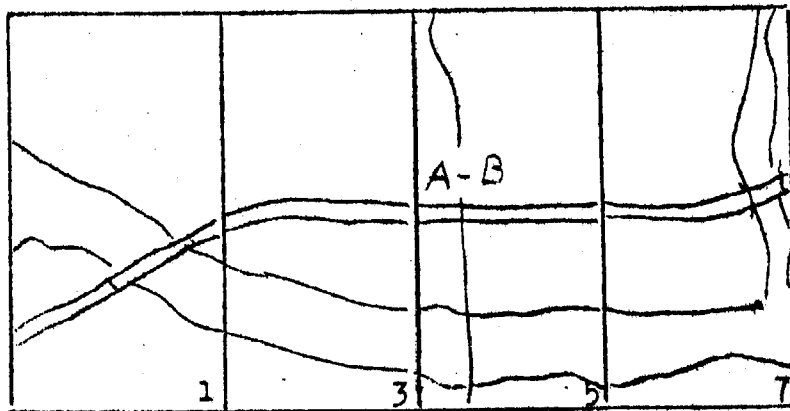

Procedure For Subdivision of One Photographic Run into Two Map Substitutes

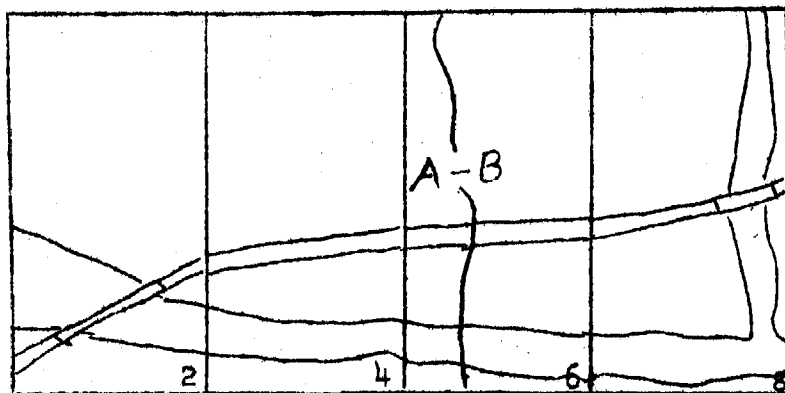
1. When a run of any sortie has greater than 50% overlap for stereovision, it can be divided to form two runs of non-stereo photographs covering, for map substitute purposes, the identical area. This is achieved by sorting the photographs into two groups, one containing the even numbered photographs and the other the odd numbered photographs, resulting in two map substitutes. The diagram below explains this method.

The most successful application of photographs as map substitutes reported to date has been the retention of basic coverage on file at Regimental and Battalion Headquarters where it is immediately available for briefings or reference. Patrols or units participating in operations can draw these photographs as required, returning them upon completion of their mission. By this method, one or more sets of basic photography may serve many purposes without replenishment.
