Cominron-3 reports administratively to Commander Mine Sweepers Western Pacific and Commander Service Division 31.

In order to preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution of the United States of America, perpetuate the invincible motto upon which our country was founded, "In God We Trust", and to support the United Nations, the President of the United States of America has directed the United States Forces to assist the Republic of Korea (Southern Korea) in conquest of invading forces. This action is in accordance with a resolution of the Security Council of the United Nations. In addition, the President of the United States has ordered the Seventh Fleet to prevent attack on Formosa by Chinese Communist (or other) forces, and, also, to prevent attacks on the mainland of China by forces of the Chinese Nationalist Government.

The President's order has been necessary in order to maintain the security of the United States of America as a free state by opposing a world-wide Communist movement based on an ideology advocating use of any means necessary, including force, to restrict the general Welfare and Blessing of Liberty not only

of the citizens of the United States of America and our Posterity, but of all the peoples of the world. This restriction would extend to prohibiting the free exercise of religion and the freedom of speech and of the press, and the right of the people to peaceably assembly and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

1. ENEMY FORCES:

As outlined in basic plans and op-orders listed above.

B. FRIENDLY FORCES:

As outlined in basic plans and op-orders listed above.

2. This force will:

A. Conduct minesweeping operations to keep harbors, harbor entrances, approaches, channels, and convoy routes checked for and clear of mines.

B. Conduct assault minesweeping operations.

C. Conduct training to give ships maximum effectiveness in accomplishing any task which has been or may be assigned.

D. Develop minesweeping tactics and countermeasures in keeping with the latest developments in mine warfare.

E. Conduct mine disposal operations, using sweeping where practical, to clear mined coastal areas and to reduce mine dangers to operating forces afloat.

F. Maintain and repair ships to be in readiness to perform above tasks.

G. Perform screening, escort, guard ship, patrol, or other duties as assigned.

3. TASKS: As directed. Directives to be issued in Annexes to this Op-Order.

4. LOGISTICS:

A. Provision to capacity weekly or as close to weekly as operations permit

B. Top off fuel earliest practicable after fuel remaining falls below 80% capacity or 15 days supply at normal operating speeds (24 hours basis) (whichever is lower percentage of capacity).

C. Take immediate steps to replace all spare parts expended, including sweep gear spares.

D. Top off ammunition earliest opportunity after ammo remaining any type falls below 85 percent of allowance.

Make own arrangements when practicable. Make noon report daily when below 2 weeks overall provisions (1 week for ES) and below figures prescribed above for fuel and ammo. Also report ammo expenditures daily as occurring.

Primary logistics support is from fleet, Service Force units of 7th Fleet and Naval Forces Far East. Secondary logistics support is from ships in operating areas about to depart for rear areas. Tertiary logistics support is from larger ships in operating areas. Mobile tending in water, diesel fuel, minor repairs, minesweeping gear will be provided from flagship and/or tender as practicable. Operating sweep gear reserve at Fleet Activities, Sasebo. Main sweep gear reserve at Fleet Activities, Yokosuka.

5. GENERAL:

A. Annex Able is basic communication annex.

B. Annex Baker is standard for overlays used for reports of minesweeping.

C. Annex Charlie is Administrative Organization of Mine Squadron THREE.

D. Tactical organization, command sequence, tasks, special communications, movement plans, special operating instructions will be prescribed by annex as need arises.

ANNEX ABLE

COMMUNICATION PLAN

When operating as a unit of Task Group 95.6, communications will be in accordance with USF 70 (B), DNC (5), and appropriate JANAF publications except as modified herein.

- (a) Task Group Common: 359.4 MCS(V) Primary Tactical and Maneuvering Net will be guarded by all US ships in Task Group 95.6. Establish communications with the OTC on this circuit.
- (b) Task Group Common (secondary): 238.4 KCS (V) secondary Tactical and Maneuvering Net. All ships will have this circuit set up and transmitters in a standby condition. If communications are lost with the Task Group Commander on the primary tactical and warning net communications will be established immediately on this circuit, except when conditions of radio silence prevent.
- (c) Small Boat Common (LCVP M/S): 38.7 MCS(V). This circuit will be guarded by the small boat controller and may be used by the AMS type sweeper if other circuits fail.
- (d) Ship-Shore Traffic: The primary means of ship-shore communications will be via Commander Task Group 95.6 who will relay traffic to local task force commander or NDT (Tokyo)
- (e) CTG 95.6 will guard or arrange a relay for circuit C19 as flagship limitations permit. Relay, if arranged, will be via local Task Group Commander.
- (f) Distress Frequency Guard will be designated separately.
- (g) 72.9 MCS(V) is the AA coordination net and may also be used as a tactical and maneuvering net as signaled by element commander.
- (h) Units unable to guard George FOX will make guardship arrangements.
- (i) Movement Reports: Senior officers present will make movement reports for units in company. All movement reports normally will be classified RESTRICTED Precedence ROUTINE. SECRET classification will be used when proceeding into enemy held waters. Higher precedence will be used only to prevent unnecessarily alerting SAR units.
- (j) Special arrangements for foreign manned ships: The primary means of communications with the ships in company manned by non-English speaking personnel will be by visual signals using the international code of signals.

(k) Voice and CW radio calls will be in accordance with appropriate JANAP publications.

(l) Units of TG 95.6 will maintain a continuous guard on 2716 KCS(V) and/or 2844 KCS(CW) when in port.

(m) Recognition signals in accordance with effective editions of JANAPS 155 to 158.

(n) ROK NAVY recognition signals in accordance with effective list distributed by Deputy Commander Naval Forces, Far East TUBAN.

(o) Authentication and IFF will be in accordance with effective FEC-SOI's.

(p) Shackles code will be used in accordance with effective edition of PAC6.

(q) Radio silence will be as directed by the Task Group Commander.

(r) Minesweepers proceeding on minesweeping operations will carry hazardous duty cryptographic allowance in accordance with CSFM 1-20.

(s) Attention is invited to instructions currently contained in ALCOM 129.

(t) During 24 days operations the tactical net will not be used for administrative traffic. Visual signals and guard mail are the primary means of handling administrative traffic.

Subj: Standards for overlays.

1. Upon completion of each days sweeping, OTC shall prepare and submit earliest a composite overlay for his element or unit as a report of days sweeping. Overlays shall be prepared as follows:

2. Tracing cloth.

3. Overlay to show

(a) In legend

(1) Chart to which overlaid

(2) Date

(3) Ships employed

(4) Formation

(5) Type(s) of sweep gear used.

(a) Details of sweep gear as depth of moored sweep, cutters in use, pulsing cycle, current employed, etc.

(6) Method of determining positions shown on chart.

(b) In overlay

(1) Minimum of one latitude and one longitude line.

(2) Best composite position of buoys (exception: use promulgated positions when check sweeping existing channels).

(3) Track of O.T.C. with local times.

(4) Areas color coded to indicate degree and type of coverage.

(a) Solid blue clearance moored sweep with numerals to indicate depth in feet.

(b) Hatched yellow or orange influence exploratory with notations to indicate coverage.

(c) Solid yellow or orange influence clearance with notations to indicate coverage.

(d) Green boundary lines to indicate boundaries of areas declared safe by notice.

(e) Red boundary lines to indicate boundaries of unswept areas and of holidays.

(5) Notations with arrows to indicate evolutions and casualties.

(6) Mine code as follows:

(a) Moored mines sighted and location estimated - solid red circle.

(b) Moored mines sighted and location determined by good fix - solid black circle ink.


(c) Influence mines located - solid yellow or orange rectangle with semicircles at ends.

(d) Mines swept or destroyed - green circle around solid circle of (a), (b), or (c).

(e) Affix a notation for reference to report of destruction of mine(s) in each instance.

4. Same symbols and codes shall be used on charts.
